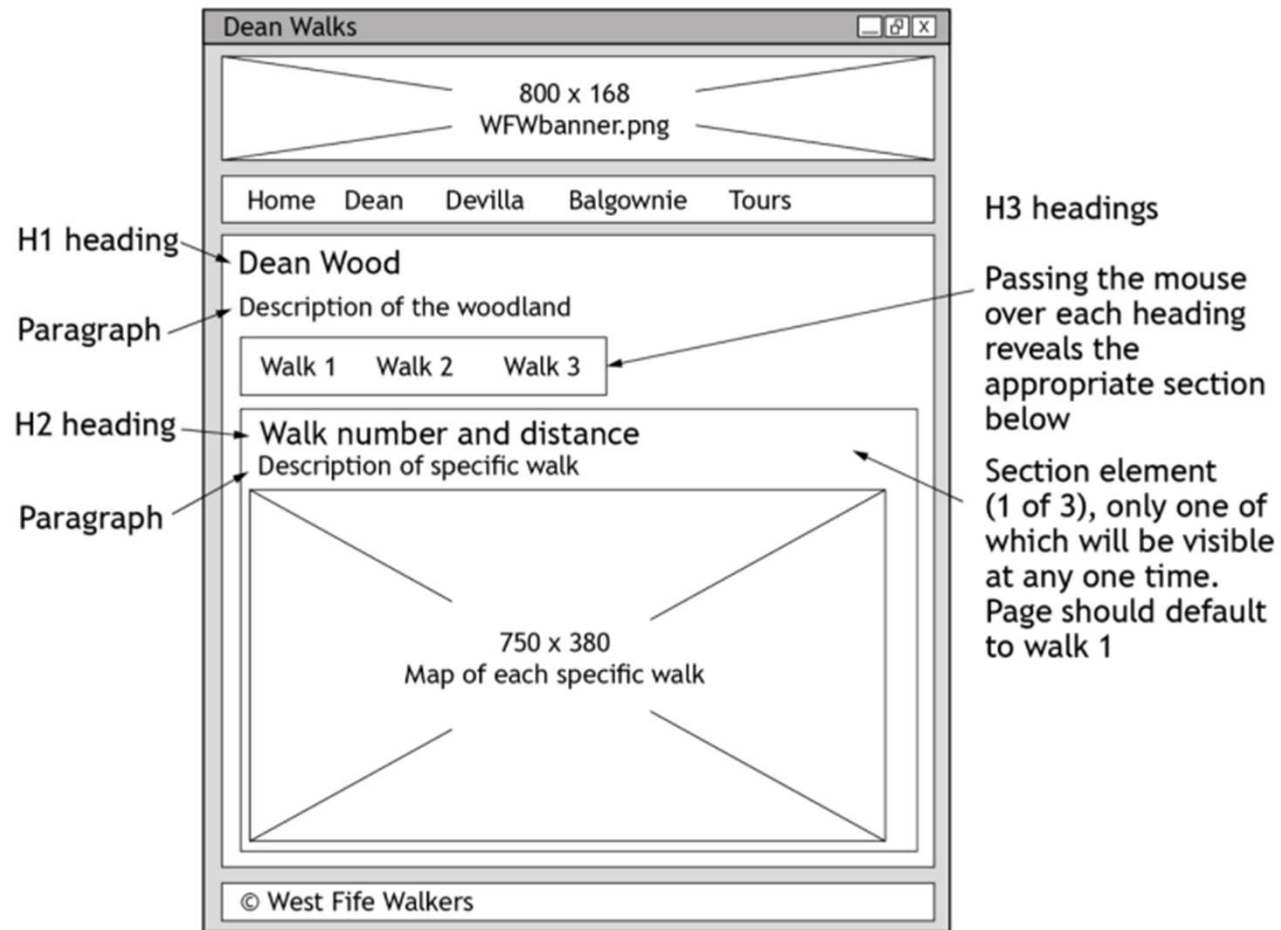

## 2023 Task 3c Example Solution

### Dean Wood

Dean wood is owned and maintained by the Forestry Commission. It has one forestry road running through the middle of the wood. The road makes for an easy walk but the better walks are to found skirting the outer edge of the wood. Areas of the woodland were harvested in 2018 creating open sunny spaces. A small burn runs through the middle of the wood from North to South. This has created a pleasant valley walk.

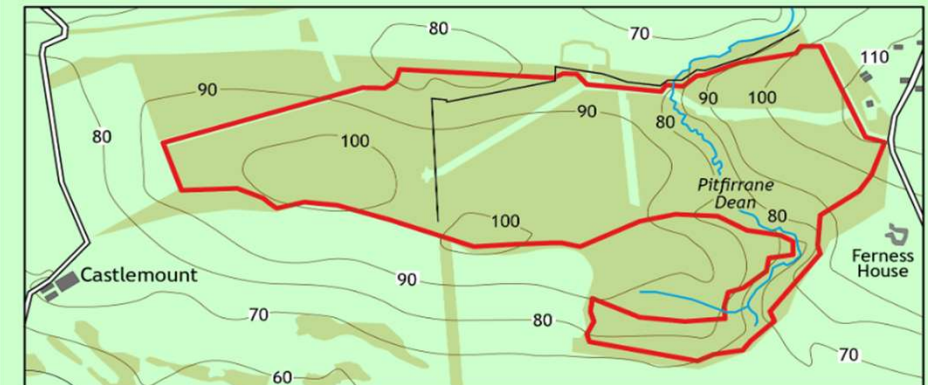
Begin each walk at the forestry gate on Lundin Road, where there is room for four cars to park.
